Session 5: Who is the Holy Spirit? What is the Trinity?

Previously, we learned that God, who is holy and perfect, is approachable and knowable. How does God make it possible for human beings, who are sinful, to have a personal relationship with Him? Additionally, we learned that Jesus Christ, God the Son, is the only way to the Father.

Although there are many well known facts about Jesus, there may be some who still do not know who Jesus really is. The Bible provides titles for Jesus that help us understand who He really is.

- Son of God - Matthew 3:17, 17:5 – Jesus is the clear revelation of God
- Son of Man - Matthew 8:20, 9:6, 11:19 – Jesus understands the experience of being human
- Lord - John 20:28, Acts 2:36 – Jesus is equal to God and above all creator
- Messiah - Matthew 16:16, John 6:69 – Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament prophecies about the Messiah

To be the only way to the Father, Jesus had to be fully human.

- Hebrews 2:17 - Jesus had to be fully human to bear the penalty of Man's sin
- Hebrews 4:15 - Jesus had to be fully human to be a sympathetic High Priest
- 1 Peter 2:21-23 - Jesus had to be fully human to be an example and a help to believers to live the Christian life

To be the only way to the Father, Jesus had to be fully God.

- Hebrews 7:25-26 - Jesus had to be fully God to be a perfect high priest and mediator between God and man
- Hebrews 10:12 - Jesus had to be fully God to be a perfect sacrifice to completely deal with the problem of sin

Once sin entered the world, God, who is holy and just, could not allow sin to go unpunished. Since Jesus was the perfect Man, His sacrificial death was necessary to pay the penalty for an infinite number of sin.

What happens now that human beings can be free from sin because of the sacrifice of Jesus? Is there any help to live this Christian life? In John 14:16-17, Jesus said, "And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that he may abide with you forever – the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you." Who is this other Helper – the Spirit of truth? How does the Holy Spirit relate to God and Jesus? In this session, we discuss and dialogue about the character and attributes of the Holy Spirit, concluding with the Trinity
