## Section 1: What is the Church?

**The main mission of the Church is to make disciples**

- **Matthew 28:19-20**
  - Go -> Baptize -> Teach
- **Acts 1:8**
  - Being witnesses
- **Ephesians 4:11-13**
  - Edifying the body of Christ is making disciples

## Section 1: What is the Church?

### **Is it a group? A building? An organization?**

- The Church refers to all believers across the world and throughout history.
- The Church can refer to a local assembly of believers.
  - Universal but local
  - Invisible but visible
- Accepting Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior is required to be a part of the Church

## Section 2: Why is the Church important?

### **What does the Bible say about the Church?**

- **Divinely instituted**
  - Ephesians 2:20-21
- **Demonstrates the love of God**
  - John 13:34-35
- **Demonstrates unity in Christ**
  - Galatians 3:28
- **A picture of mutual submission**
  - Philippians 2:4

## Section 2: Why is the Church important?

### **Why are so many denominations?**

- We can have diversity of expression in worship.
- Division among believers is not acceptable.
  - Divisions indicate immaturity – 1 Corinthians 3:3-4
  - Seek peace with other believers – Romans 14:19



## Section 2: Why is the Church important?

### **What are the different types of church government?**

- The form of church government is not an extensive topic in the Bible.
- Governed by a bishop or overseer
  - 1 Timothy 3:1
- Governed by elders
  - Acts 14:23
- Governed by the pure democracy

## Section 3: What does a healthy church look like?

**What does a healthy church look like?**

**Acts 2:42 provides key activities of a healthy church**

- Apostles' doctrine
- Fellowship
- Breaking bread (Lord's Supper)
- Prayer

Corporately and individually

## Section 3: What does a healthy church look like?

### **Apostles' doctrine**

- **Regular Bible teaching is a priority**
  - Acts 17:2
  - 2 Timothy 4:2
- **Our church uses a verse-by-verse teaching style**
  - Acts 20:26-27
- **Individually, regular Bible study should be a priority**
  - Acts 17:11

## Section 3: What does a healthy church look like?

### **Fellowship**

- **Regular fellowship is a priority**
  - Acts 20:7
  - Hebrews 10:25
- **Fellowship provides an opportunity to build meaningful lives together**
  - Hebrews 10:24-25
- **Individually, fellowship should be a priority**
  - 1 Corinthians 14:26

### **Breaking Bread – The Lord's Supper**

- **The Lord's Supper is a priority**

- Matthew 26:26-30
- 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

- **Prayer is a priority**

- John 17:20
- Ephesians 1:16

  - Becoming more like Jesus by applying the Bible to our lives
- **Go**
