

CRAFT [20 min] Presents for Parents

Supplies

- “Magnets for Dad” handout, printed on card stock (1 per child) (download [here](#))
- markers
- scissors
- adhesive magnets (1 per child)
- green chenille wires
- construction paper (in a variety of colors)
- rulers
- transparent tape
- glue sticks

Easy Prep

- Make a sample of each craft to show kids.



Make a Present for a Parent

Show kids the sample crafts you made.

Say: **Today you get to choose between two crafts! You're going to make a present for a parent or someone who's like a parent to you. You can decide whether the person you're making a present for would rather have a flower or a magnet.**

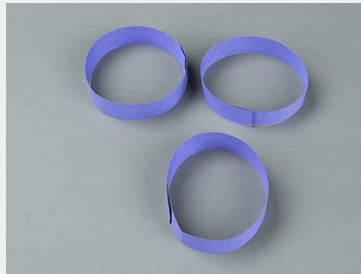
Distribute handouts, set out the supplies to share, and have kids follow the directions below. (Kids may have time to make only one of the gifts, but if any kids finish early, they can start a second gift.)

Make Magnets

- Choose a shape on the "Magnets for Dad" handout, or draw your own shape you think your recipient would like.
- Cut out the shape and decorate it. Write a kind message on it.
- Attach a magnet to the back so the person you give it to can stick it on a toolbox or file cabinet.

Make Flowers

- Cut three 1x12-inch strips of construction paper.
- Make a loop out of each strip, and glue the ends together.



- When you have three loops, stack them and glue the centers all together to form a flower shape.



- Cut a 1-inch circle of construction paper, and glue it in the center of the flower.
- Tape a chenille wire to the back of the flower
