



URBAN SURF CAMP HEALTH AND SAFETY PLAN

Disclaimer: Urban Surf Ministries agrees with Federal, State and Local guidelines by asking those with serious underlying health conditions to not come to camp.

Initial Preparations

- Prepare and distribute policy guidelines allowing staff to familiarize themselves with the material
- Prepare and distribute documentation to parents/legal guardians of campers to explain rules and guidelines for campers to follow during their time at camp.
- Prepare relevant posters and signage from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), World Health Organization (WHO), and/or other accredited health agencies and post in appropriate places where intended audiences can be reached.

Pre-Screening

- Taking temperatures prior to any entrance to the building upon time of set up and registration using our no-touch thermometer.
 - Anyone febrile will not be permitted to enter the building; if the person(s) are campers and or staff, unfortunately will not be able to attend the camp.
- COVID Screening forms will be required to be filled out after temperature is taken upon time of set up and registration for all persons entering the building. This will only be REQUIRED upon ANYONES arrival to the building with need to enter (No matter their purpose).
 - Anyone having direct contact with someone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 14-days will not be allowed to camp.



Daily Screenings

- Anyone febrile at these times or presenting with symptoms, will be quarantined and will be treated for symptoms. We will unfortunately have to have the individual not attend the remainder of camp. If staff member, they will be advised to be tested for COVID-19 upon dismissal. If camper, we will arrange to have them picked up and advise their parent/legal guardian to have them tested for COVID-19 upon their dismissal.
- If anyone participating in Urban Surf presents with a fever or is dismissed for showing symptoms all staff, campers, and parents/legal guardians will be notified.

Morning

- Daily temperature screenings will be required for all campers and staff at a designated time prior to leaving their rooms/dorm rooms. Each room will be screened one at a time before each individual is permitted to exit their room.

Post Beach

- Temperatures will also be taken upon arrival from time at the beach. Vans will be unloaded one at a time and each person's temp will be taken before entering the building.

Evening

- Final temperature screening will take place before staff and campers head back to their rooms for the night. Each room must be screened together before lights out.



Cleaning/Hygiene Procedures

Prior to the arrival of campers and after their departure, a licensed cleaning company (Total Concord Cleaning) will conduct a full deconstruction sterilization of the heavy trafficked areas in the church

- Facility will be cleaned twice a day by using the recommendations of the CDC and EPA that cleaning disinfectants should have an alcohol-based solution that is 60% or higher in content for disinfecting solid surface areas.
 - Vans will be disinfected and whipped down every night for the following day of use.
- Hand washing/sanitizing stations are located at all areas where groups are present.
- Hand Hygiene will be required prior to entering dining areas, chapel, vans, and dorm rooms.
- Hand Hygiene and masks will be strictly enforced especially to all kitchen staff.
- Masks will be required for everyone during times of transportation.
- During dining times, meals will be served. No one other than the designated servers will be permitted to serve the food during meals.
- No one other than kitchen staff and designated staff will be permitted in the kitchen area or snack areas. Masks and hand hygiene required to enter these areas.



Social Distancing

Housing

- Per CDC recommendations, sleeping areas will try to make sure faces are at least 6 feet apart. Mats/beds will be aligned so campers and counselors sleep head-to-toe.
- Dorm access will only be allowed to individuals who reside in that dorm. Campers will not be permitted inside dorms not their own. Other staff members will also be limited to their access to rooms/dorms not their own.
- Campers should keep personal belongings organized and separate from other campers' belongings.

Chapels

- Chapels will be enforcing social distancing. Chairs will be spaced out and campers will be required to sit with their dorm groups with their counselors.

Dining

- Tables in the dining area will be spaced out. Each table will limit how many occupants per round table.
- Dorm groups will be required to stay together as best as possible for meal times held in the building.
